

Woven Magnets

This project is adapted from the Tile Wrap Project that first appeared in *Time to Weave* by Jane Patrick

These are fun and quick to make. Here, left over 2" ceramic tiles are used, but you could substitute sturdy mat board.

Materials Embroidery floss or yarn in a variety of colors, tapestry needle, magnet adhesive sheet (look for this at craft stores), cut slightly smaller than the tile.

Weaving

Step 1: Leave a tail and tape it temporarily to the back of the tile.

Step 2: Wrap around the tile, pulling each round so that it is flat and snug against the tile.

Step 3: When the last round is wound, cut off the floss leaving a tail and tie the beginning and ending tails together.

Step 4: Measure 3-1/3 yards of embroidery floss in a contrasting color. Temporarily secure it to the back of the tile.

Step 5: Thread the tapestry needle and weave over and under (or any pattern, really) across the front and directly across the back without weaving. Come around to the front again and repeat. After the last row is woven, leave a tail and tie the two ends together.

Step 6: Cut a magnetic adhesive sheet slightly smaller than the tile and firmly press it onto the back of the tile.

Variations

A set of several magnets woven with the same pattern but different colors has its own special charm.
